The Invocation

P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God the Father, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you.

C: And also with you.

The Confession of Sins

P: God invites us to come into his presence and worship him with humble and penitent hearts. Therefore, let us acknowledge our sinfulness and ask him to forgive us.

C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

P: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of the Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen!

Lord have Mercy

P: Jesus was born for us. Jesus lived and died for us. Jesus rose from the dead, and returned to heaven for us. Through his intercession, we know God the Father will hear and answer us for our good. With this confidence, we pray:

P: For the well-being of your holy church in all the world and for those who offer here their worship and praise; hear our prayer, O Lord.




P: Merciful God, maker and preserver of life, uphold us by your power and keep us in your tender care.

Genesis 17:1-7

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram and said to him, "I am God Almighty. Walk before me

and be blameless. ²I will make my covenant between me and you, and I will make your descendants very numerous."

³Abram fell on his face. God spoke with him. He said, ⁴"As for me, this is my covenant with you. You will be the father of many nations. ⁵Your name will not be Abram anymore, but your name will be Abraham, for I have made you the father of a large group of nations. ⁶I will make you extremely fruitful, and I will produce nations from you. Kings will come out of you. ⁷I will establish my covenant between me and you and your descendants after you as an everlasting covenant throughout their generations. But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son to be born of a woman, so that he would be born under the law, ⁵in order to redeem those under the law, so that we would be adopted as sons. ⁶And because you are sons, God sent the Spirit of his Son

into our hearts to shout, "Abba, Father!" ⁷So you are no longer a slave, but a son. And if you are a son, then you are also an heir of God through Christ.

The Confession of Faith

(We will join in the words of the Nicene Creed)

P: Lift up your hearts.




C: We lift them up to the Lord.


P: Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.

The Words of Institution



Then he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying: "Drink from it, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me."
