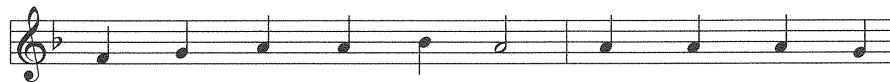

Absolution

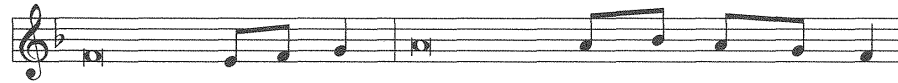
God's Forgiveness Proclaimed
