#### Preparation for Worship

P: Let us worship and praise our glorious Lord who comes to bless us with his love, who releases us from fear, and who shines in our hearts with his saving light: God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. It is in his name we pray:

**C: O gracious God and Lord, who proclaims his faithful promise and keeps it, be with us and bless us through your Word. Bring us guidance and comfort. Give us both light and life through the coming Savior so that we can joyfully praise you—our God, our Lord, our Savior, and our Comforter. Amen.**

#### The Confession of Sins

*1 John 1:5-10*

P: Dearly loved in the Lord! <sup>5</sup>This is the message we heard from him and proclaim to you: God is light. In him there is no darkness at all. <sup>6</sup>If we say we have fellowship with him but still walk in darkness, we are lying and do not put the truth into practice. <sup>7</sup>But if we walk in the light, just as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus Christ, his Son, cleanses us from all sin. <sup>8</sup>If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. <sup>9</sup>If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. <sup>10</sup>If we say we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar, and his Word is not in us.

P: Recognizing we have sinned, and acknowledging God’s Word has brought us to repentance, let us join in confessing those sins we know, and even those of which we are not aware.

**C: O Almighty God, merciful Father, I a poor miserable sinner must plead guilty to all my sins and iniquities with which I have ever offended you. I must also confess I justly deserve your punishment, for now and for all eternity. But I am truly sorry I have sinned against you, and I humbly repent of every evil I have done. I also place myself at your mercy, and I pray that for the sake the holy, innocent, bitter sufferings and death of your dearly loved Son Jesus Christ, you would be gracious and merciful to me a sinner.**

**Absolution**

*1 John 2:1-2*

P: The apostle John writes: My children, I write these things to you so that you will not sin. If anyone does sin, we have an Advocate before the Father: Jesus Christ, the Righteous One. <sup>2</sup>He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the whole world.

P: Now, as a called servant of God's Word, I can assure you he has heard and answered your prayer. He has forgiven all your sins. He has removed your guilt forever. He has brought you out of darkness and into his wonderful light. All this he did through the precious work of his Son, our Savior Jesus Christ. Be confident all is forgiven. Live in his grace and peace. Rejoice that God has brought you out of the darkness of death and into light and life of heaven.

**C: Amen.**

P: In the peace of forgiveness, let us praise the Lord.

### **The Lessons from God's Word** *"Your Word is the Joy of My Heart!"*

#### **Old Testament**

*Isaiah 35:1-10*

<sup>1</sup>The wilderness and the desert will be glad. The wasteland of the Arabah will rejoice and blossom like a crocus. <sup>2</sup>It will bloom lavishly, and there will be great joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon will be given to it. It will be excellent like Carmel and Sharon. They will see the glory of the LORD, the majesty of our God.

<sup>3</sup>Strengthen the weak hands, and make the shaky knees steady.

<sup>4</sup>Tell those who have a fearful heart: Be strong. Do not be afraid.

Look! Your God will come with vengeance. With God's own retribution, he will come and save you.

<sup>5</sup>Then the eyes of the blind will be opened, and the ears of the deaf will be unplugged. <sup>6</sup>The crippled will leap like a deer, and the tongue of the mute will sing for joy. Waters will flow in the wilderness, and streams in the wasteland. <sup>7</sup>The burning sand will become a pool, and in the thirsty ground there will be springs of water. There will be grass, reeds, and rushes where the haunts of jackals once lay.

<sup>8</sup>A highway will be there, a road that will be called the holy way. The impure will not walk there. It will be reserved for those who walk in that holy way. Wicked fools will not wander onto it. <sup>9</sup>No lion will be there, nor will any ferocious animal go up on it. They will not be found there, but only the redeemed will walk there.

<sup>10</sup>Then those ransomed by the LORD will return. They will enter Zion with a joyful shout, and everlasting joy will crown their heads. Happiness and joy will overtake them, and sorrow and sighing will flee away.

P: <sup>1</sup> The one who lives in the shelter of the Most High will stay in the shadow of the Almighty.

**C: <sup>2</sup> I will say to the LORD, "My refuge and my fortress, my God in whom I trust."**

P: <sup>9</sup> Yes, you, LORD, are my refuge!

**C: If you make the Most High your shelter, <sup>10</sup> evil will not overtake you. Disaster will not come near your tent.**

P: <sup>11</sup> Yes, he will give a command to his angels concerning you, to guard you in all your ways.

**Epistle**

*James 5:7-11*

<sup>7</sup>Therefore, beloved, be patient until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the valuable harvest from the ground, patiently waiting for it, until it receives the early and late rain. <sup>8</sup>You be patient too. Strengthen your hearts because the coming of the Lord is near.

<sup>9</sup>Do not complain about one another, brothers, so that you will not be judged. Look! The Judge is standing at the doors! <sup>10</sup>Brothers, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord as an example of suffering with patient endurance. <sup>11</sup>See, we consider those who endured to be blessed. ### **Gospel**

*Matthew 11:2-11*

<sup>2</sup>While John was in prison, he heard about the things Christ was doing. He sent two of his disciples <sup>3</sup>to ask him, “Are you the Coming One or should we wait for someone else?”

<sup>4</sup>Jesus answered them, “Go, report to John what you hear and see: <sup>5</sup>The blind receive sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy are cured, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the gospel is preached to the poor. <sup>6</sup>Blessed is the one who does not take offense at me.”

<sup>7</sup>As these two were leaving, Jesus began to talk to the crowds about John. “What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed shaken by the wind? <sup>8</sup>What did you go out to see? A man dressed in soft clothing? No, those who wear soft clothing are in kings' houses. <sup>9</sup>So what did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you! And he is much more than a prophet. <sup>10</sup>This is the one about whom it is written, ‘Look, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you.’ <sup>11</sup>Amen I tell you: Among those born of women there has not appeared anyone greater than John the Baptist. Yet whoever is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.”

P: This is the Word of our God—our comfort in distress, our strength in temptation, and our hope in despair.

### **Service of the Advent Candle**

P: In my distress I called upon the Lord, and he delivered me. This was the psalmist’s confidence, and it is ours. In our sadness there is joy. In our gloom there is relief. In our anguish there is comfort. These have been secured and provided by the coming Savior, our Lord Jesus Christ. He is the one into who we put our hope. He is the one who comes with the glorious light of his rescue and shatters the darkness of our sin-darkened lives.

### **Psalm 25:1-3, 15-18, 20** \_\_\_\_\_

<sup>1</sup>To you, O LORD, I will lift up my soul. <sup>2</sup>In you I have trusted, O my God. Do not let me be put to shame. Do not let my enemies triumph over me. <sup>3</sup>All who hope in you will never be put to shame, but those who are treacherous for no reason will be put to shame.

<sup>15</sup>My eyes are always on the LORD, because he frees my feet from the net. <sup>16</sup>Turn toward me and be gracious to me, because I am lonely and afflicted. <sup>17</sup>The distress of my heart increases.
