P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God the Father and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you.

C: And also with you.

The Confession of Sins

P: Dear friends, on this the celebration of our Savior's birth, let us examine our hearts that we may receive the special comfort, joy and peace given by God to all who humbly confess their sins.

C: When we examine ourselves we find nothing in us but sin and death. Our best works are nothing more than filthy rags, completely unworthy of any merit before God. We also know there is no escape from the eternal consequences of our sinful rebellion.

P: This is why our Lord had to have mercy on us. Even in his justice he did not want sinners to die. So he sent his Son to be our Substitute. He took on our flesh and blood. He took our place under the Law. He even consented to endure the punishment we deserved because of our sin. Therefore, trusting solely in the perfect obedience of our Savior, Jesus Christ, let us place ourselves at his mercy.

C: O Almighty and most merciful Father, we must confess that we are completely corrupted by sin. We see disobedience in our thoughts, in our words, and in our every action. We must also confess, we deserve nothing from you except your just judgment on our lives. But we come pleading the merits of our Savior Jesus Christ, and we humbly pray: Lord have mercy on us!

The Absolution

P: Because of the perfect obedience of Jesus as our Substitute, we can be confident God has heard and answered our prayers. We can also be confident our sins are forgiven. Truly, God is good to all who call on him and have faith in his Son. Thankful for this great outpouring of grace, let us join in praising God with our voices, and by serving him with our lives. Amen.

The Christmas Gospel

Luke 2:1-20

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to his own town to register. So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child.

While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her first born, a son. She wrapped him in strips of cloth and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, “Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in strips of cloth and lying in a manger.”

Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, “Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom his favor rests.”

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, “Let’s go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about.”

So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby who was lying in the manger. When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart.

The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

of one being with the Father.**

was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary,
and became fully human.**

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate.

He suffered death and was buried.

**On the third day he rose again in accordance

Prayer for Christmas Day

*(the congregation will read responsively the words of the
Hymn— “Peace Came to Earth”)*

P: Lord God, heavenly Father, Creator and Preserver of all things seen and unseen, we praise you for the special love you have shown us, your fallen and sinful creatures. You have kept your word and sent your Son to be born as the promised Savior and Redeemer.

**C: Peace came to earth at last that chosen night
When angels clove the sky with song and light
And God embodied love and sheathed his might —
Who could but gasp: Immanuel!
Who could by sing: Immanuel!**

P: Lord Jesus Christ, we marvel at your servant-like heart, which moved you to do your Father's will and take on our flesh. You became fully human so that you might live the holy and perfect life we could not live, endure the agony of the cross we deserved, and suffer death as our substitute.

**C: And who could be the same for having held
The infant in their arms and later felt
The wounded hands and side, all doubts dispelled —
Who could but sigh: Immanuel!
Who could but shout: Immanuel!**

P: O Holy Spirit, we thank you for your saving work of bringing us to faith in our newborn Savior. You have opened our eyes to see that, despite his humble appearance and lowly circumstances, this child who lies in Bethlehem's manger is the mighty God, the Redeemer of the world.

**C: You show the Father none has ever seen,
In flesh and blood you bore our griefs and pain,
In bread and wine you visit us again —
Who could but see: Immanuel!
Who could but thrill: Immanuel!**

P: God of our rescue, as you have brought us to faith in the Christ

Child, so we ask that you would work powerfully also in the hearts of those who do not yet know him or who do not know him in truth. Grant that the world's attention to the Christ Child may not be only a seasonal attraction or a sentimental novelty. Rather, bring sinners to faith that they may see him as the answer to life's problems now, and the sure hope of life eternal in heaven with you.

**C: How else could I have known you, O my God!
How else could I have loved you, O my God!
How else could I embrace you, O my God!
Who could but pray: Immanuel!
Who could but praise: Immanuel!**

Special prayers and intercessions may follow.

P: Let the joyous message of Christmas be proclaimed throughout the world, and may it find ready acceptance in believing hearts, for the rescue of lost souls, for the spread of your kingdom, and for the glory of your holy name.

C: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom his favor rests."
