The Invocation

P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God the Father, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you.

C: And also with you.

The Confession of Sins

P: God invites us to come into his presence and worship him with humble and penitent hearts. Therefore, let us acknowledge our sinfulness and ask him to have mercy on us.

For the disobedience and rebellion we inherited from our first parents, and for our sin-stained hearts which put us justly under your judgment, we cry out;



P: For the sins of weakness and the sins of willfulness, for our disobedience in our thoughts, words, and actions, and because of the worthlessness of even our best works, we confess;



P: For your invitation to come to you with broken and burdened

hearts, for your undeserved love, and for your forgiveness which removes our guilt and punishment, we humbly pray;



C: Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.

The Assurance of our Forgiveness

P: God, our heavenly Father, has been merciful to us and has given his only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Therefore, as a called servant of the Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.



P: For the undeserved compassion of our God and Savior, let us rejoice with the psalmist who confessed, "How blessed is the one whose rebellion is forgiven, whose sin is covered. How blessed is the one whose guilt the LORD does not charge against him, in whose spirit there is no deceit."

It is for this forgiveness that we rejoice to confess: the works of the Lord are great and glorious; his name is worthy of praise —

Acts 2:8-12



⁴As you come to him, the Living Stone, rejected by men but chosen by God and precious, ⁵you also, like living stones, are being built as a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, in order to bring spiritual sacrifices that are acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶For it says in Scripture:

See, I lay a stone in Zion, a chosen and precious cornerstone, and the one who believes in him will certainly not be put to shame.

⁷Therefore, for you who believe, this is an honor. But for those who do not believe:

The stone which the builders rejected has become the cornerstone, ⁸ and, a stone over which they stumble and a rock over which they fall.

Because they continue to disobey the word, they stumble over it. And that is the consequence appointed for them.


⁹But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, the people who are God's own possession, so that you may proclaim the praises of him who called you out of darkness into


his marvelous light. ¹⁰At one time you were not a people, but now you are the people of God. At one time you were not shown mercy, but now you have been shown mercy.




P: Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.
