Welcome & Prologue

"The catechism is the Bible of the layman, which contains the whole body of Christian teaching necessary to bring every Christian to salvation . . . For that reason we should hold the catechism honorable and worthy, then use it diligently among the youth, because in it has been gathered together all the true, real, ancient, pure and godly teachings of the holy Christian Church."

In God's Grace We Gather as Baptized People The Sacrament of Holy Baptism

P: God saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life.

C: As we come together to worship, we remember that we gather as baptized people. Our baptism in the name of the Triune God offers comfort in distress, hope in adversity, and strength in time of temptation. It is God's gracious covenant with us through which he declares that we are his children and heirs of life in heaven.

P: Therefore, as baptized people, we worship in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.C: Amen!

Opening Hymn

"O Word of God Incarnate" Christian Worship 279

God holds Us before the Mirror of His Law The Ten Commandments

P: In the Law, that is the Ten Commandments, the righteous, immutable will of God is revealed to all people. In that Law our disobedience and rebellion is clearly revealed, and we are forever bound to our sins. We are sentenced to punishment and shackled eternally to death and Satan. It is not the purpose of the Law to save, but to condemn.

C: St. Paul declares, "no one will be declared righteous in his sight by observing the Law; rather, through the Law we become conscious of sin."

P: Because our hearts are laid bare and our secrets are revealed,

we must acknowledge our sinfulness to the Lord, and seek his mercy.

C: O Lord, hear my prayer, listen to my cry for mercy, And in your faithfulness, come to my relief; Do not bring your servant into judgment, For no one living is righteous before you. Answer me quickly, O Lord; my spirit fails. Do not hide your face from me, for I have put my trust in you. Show me the way I should go, For to you I lift up my soul.

God's Grace Leads Us to Confess Our Sins Confession

P: Confession, as Luther writes, has two parts. The one is that we confess our sins; the other, that we receive absolution or forgiveness from the pastor as from God himself, not doubting but firmly believing that our sins are thus forgiven before God in heaven.

C: Almighty God, merciful Father, I, a troubled and repentant sinner, confess that I have sinned against you in my thoughts, my words, and my actions. I have not loved you with my whole heart; I have not loved others as I should. I am distressed by the sins that trouble me and am deeply sorry for them.

Response by Congregation "Jesus Sinners Does Receive" Christian Worship 304 st. 5

I, a sinner, come to you With a penitent confession. Savior, show me mercy, too; Grant for all my sins remission. Let these words my soul relieve --Jesus sinners does receive.

God's Grace Proclaims that We are Forgiven The Use of the Keys

P: The use of the Keys is that special power and right which Christ gave to his church on earth: to forgive the sins of penitent sinners but to refuse forgiveness to the impenitent as long as they do not repent.

C: We believe Jesus when said to his church: "If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven." We also believe his death has paid for the guilt of our sins, as well as the sins of the whole world.

P: May it be to you as you have believed. Therefore, as a called servant of the Word, and because of the promise of our Savior Jesus Christ, together with his death and resurrection, I forgive you all your sins. Be assured that you are a dear child of God and an heir of eternal life.

C: Amen!

God Grace Guides Us in Love and Service The Third Use of the Law

Old Testament

Micah 3:5-12

⁵This is what the LORD says concerning the prophets who mislead my people:

Give them something to chew with their teeth, and they de-

clare peace, but they declare a holy war against anyone who doesn't put something into their mouths.

⁶Therefore, a night without prophetic vision will come upon you. Darkness will come upon you, without any omens from God. The sun will set for the prophets, and daytime will become dark for them. ⁷The seers will be ashamed, and the fortune tellers will hide in disgrace. They will all cover their mouths, because there will be no answer from God.

⁸I, on the other hand, I am full of power from the Spirit of the LORD, full of judgment and strength, to declare Jacob's sinful rebellion to him and Israel's sin to him.

⁹Hear this, you heads of the house of Jacob. Listen attentively, leaders of the house of Israel, you who have contempt for justice and pervert everything that is right, ¹⁰you who build Zion with blood and Jerusalem with injustice. ¹¹Her leaders render verdicts for a bribe, and her priests issue rulings for a payoff. Her prophets foretell the future for silver, yet they lean on the LORD and say, "The LORD is in our midst, isn't he? Disaster will not come upon us."

¹²Therefore, because of you, Zion will be plowed like a field. Jerusalem will become a heap of ruins, and the Temple Mount will become a wooded hill.

Epistle

1 Thessalonians 2:1–13

¹Indeed, brothers, you yourselves know that our visit to you was not a waste of time. ²Even though we had suffered previously and were treated shamefully in Philippi (as you know), we were bold in our God to speak the gospel of God to you in the face of great opposition. ³For our appeal does not come from error or impure motives, or by way of deceit. ⁴Instead, just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the gospel, so we speak, not to please people but God, who examines our hearts. ⁵Indeed, as you know, we never at any time used flattering speech, nor did we act with greed as a motive. God is our witness. ⁶Also, we did not seek the praise of people (neither yours nor anyone else's), ⁷even though we could have been a burden as Christ's apostles. On the contrary, we were gentle among you, like a nursing mother taking care of her own children. ⁸We yearned for you so much that we were delighted to share with you not only the gospel of God, but also our own lives, because you had become dear to us.

⁹Surely, brothers, you remember our labor and hardship! We worked night and day so that we would not be a burden to any of you, while we preached the gospel of God to you. ¹⁰You are witnesses, and so is God, of how devout, righteous, and blameless we were toward you who believe. ¹¹In the same way, you know that we treated each of you as a father deals with his own children: ¹²encouraging, comforting, and urging you to live lives worthy of God, who is calling you into his kingdom and glory.

¹³There is also another reason we give thanks to God unceasingly, namely, when you received God's word, which you heard from us, you did not receive it as the word of men but as the word of God (as it really is), which is now at work in you who believe.

Theme for the Day

P: The LORD set up a testimony for Jacob. In Israel he established the law. He commanded our fathers to make it known to their children. Then they would put their confidence in God,

and they would not forget the deeds of God, but they would keep his commands. Then they would not be like their fathers, a stubborn, rebellious generation.



Gospel

Matthew 23:1–12

¹Then Jesus spoke to the crowds and to his disciples. ²He said, "The experts in the law and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat. ³So practice and observe whatever they tell you. But do not do as they do, because they do not practice what they preach. ⁴They tie up heavy loads, burdens that are hard to carry, and place them on people's shoulders, but they will not lift a finger to help them. ⁵They do all their works to be seen by people. They make their phylacteries wide and lengthen the fringes of their garments. ⁶They love the place of honor at feasts, the best seats in the synagogues, ⁷the greetings in the marketplaces, and being called 'Rabbi' by people. ⁸But you are not to be called 'Rabbi,' for you have one Teacher, and you are all brothers. ⁹Also do not call anyone on earth your 'Father,' for you have one Father, and he is in heaven. ¹⁰And you are not to be called 'leaders,' for you have one Leader, the Christ. ¹¹But the greatest among you will be your servant. ¹²Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

P: This is the Word of our God;

C: Sanctify us by the truth; your Word is truth!

Sermon

Matthew 23:12

"Lord, Keep Us Humble!"

As we hear your Word As we follow your Will

God's Grace Leads us to Confess our Faith The Apostles Creed

P: A creed is a statement of what we believe, teach, and confess. The creed with which we confess our faith is the Apostles Creed. It is called the Apostles Creed, not because it was written by the apostles, but because it briefly states the doctrine which God proclaimed through the apostles and taught through the Scriptures. It is this teaching that leads us to believe in the Triune God - God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. C: We confess our faith in the Triune God, because St. Paul writes: "For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved."

(the congregation will rise for the Confession of Faith)

P: I now ask you, all you who are gathered here today: Do you believe in God the Father?

C: Yes, I believe in God the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

P: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
C: Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead.

P: Do you believe in God, the Holy Spirit?C: Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit; the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints;

the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen!

God's Grace Invites us to Pray The Lord's Prayer

P: Luther writes: "You must base your prayer on God's Word and promise, yes, on his own command and bidding, and say: Dear Lord, you know that I do not appear before you of my own accord and out of personal presumption, or because of any worthiness in me. For if I were to look at those things, I would not dare raise my eyes to you and would not know how to begin to pray. But I come because you yourself have bidden and earnestly requested us to call on you and have also promised us a hearing. Besides this, you have sent your own Son, who has taught us what we are to pray, and has spoken the very words for us."

C: Our Father in heaven;

P: With these words God tenderly invites us to believe that he is our true Father and that we are his true children, so that we may pray to him as boldly and confidently as dear children ask their dear father.

C: Hallowed be your name;

P: God's name is certainly holy by itself, but we pray in this petition that we too may keep it holy.

C: Your kingdom come.

P: God's kingdom certainly comes by itself even without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may also come to us.

C: Your will be done on earth as in heaven.

P: God's good and gracious will certainly is done without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may be done among us also.

C: Give us today our daily bread.

P: God surely gives daily bread without our asking, even to all the wicked, but we pray in this petition that he would lead us to realize this and to receive our daily bread with thanksgiving.

C: Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us.

P: We pray in this petition that our Father in heaven would not look upon our sins or because of them deny our prayers; for we are worthy of none of things for which we ask, neither have we deserved them, but we ask that he would give them all to us by grace; for we daily sin much and surely deserve nothing but punishment. So we too will forgive from the heart and gladly do good to those who sin against us.

C: Lead us not into temptation.

P: God surely tempts no one to sin, but we pray in this petition that God would guard and keep us, so that the devil, the world, and our flesh may not deceive us or lead us into false belief, despair, and other great and shameful sins; and though we are tempted by them, we pray that we may overcome and win the victory.

C: But deliver us from evil.

P: We pray in this petition that our Father in heaven would deliver us from every evil that threatens body and soul, property and reputation, and finally when our last hour comes, grant us a blessed end and graciously take us from this world of sorrow to himself in heaven.

C: For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen!

P: We can be sure that these petitions are acceptable to our Father in heaven and are heard by him, for he himself has commanded us to pray in this way and has promised to hear us. Therefore we say, "Amen! Yes, it shall be so."

Hymn of Preparation "Jesus, Your Blood and Righteousness"

- Jesus, your blood and righteousness My beauty are, my glorious dress; Mid flaming worlds, in these arrayed, With joy shall I lift up my head.

God's Grace Assures Us We can Live in Peace The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper

P: To bring us into his family of believers, our Savior has blessed us with the gift of Baptism. To keep us in his family he has also blessed us with the gift of the Lord's Supper. In this Sacrament he gives us his true body and his true blood, in, with, and under the bread and the wine. Scripture teaches us to prepare ourselves for the proper reception of this holy and precious gift.

C: God's Word assures me that Jesus led a pure and holy life for me, and died on the cross for me to pay the full price for all my sins. Through faith in Jesus, I have been clothed in my Savior's perfect righteousness and holiness.

P: Through faith Jesus gives me his body and his blood together with the bread and the wine as a truly life-giving food and drink to unite me with him and my fellow believers. By means of this sacrament, Jesus not only forgives my sins but sweeps away all my doubts about his love for me, gives me his own strength to live a God-pleasing life, and grants me a joyful foretaste of heaven.

C: How can I be sure that I receive all these blessings in the Lord's Supper?

P: I have his own word spoken as his last will and testament on the night before he died. There he tells me: "Take and eat; this is my body. Drink from it, all of you; this is my blood which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in remembrance of me."

C: In response to this priceless gift, I will daily thank and praise him for his love to me. With his help I will fight temptation, do my best to correct whatever wrongs I have done, and serve him and those around me with love and good works.

The Words of Institution:

P: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night he was betrayed, took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take and eat; this is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Then he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me.

P: The peace of the Lord be with your always!
