The Invocation

P: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God the Father, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you.

Opening Hymn

Prepare My Heart through Faithfulness

P: "Be faithful, even to the point of death." This is the Lord's will for our lives as his redeemed people. Sadly, we can never achieve the perfect faithfulness he desires. Our works never meet his expectations. Our ability to stand against temptation is never

sufficient. Our preparations to welcome him are met with daily distractions. Although we are unfaithful, God remains faithful. He keeps his promises, and in his faithfulness, he continues to show us undeserved love and patience. It is because of God's faithfulness that we can come before him and confess our sins of disobedience and rebellion.

C: Almighty God, merciful Father, I, a troubled and repentant sinner, confess that I have sinned against you in my thoughts, my words, and my actions. I have not loved you with my whole heart; I have not loved others as I should. I am distressed by the sins that trouble me and am deeply sorry for them.

Prepare My Heart through Your Faithfulness

P: God has heard and answered your plea for mercy, and has given his one and only Son to be the atoning sacrifice for your sins. Be assured nothing can separate you from the undeserved love of God. Be confident of God's powerful rescue in Christ Jesus. Be at peace because all your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

- P: In his faithfulness God calls to us through his prophet: "Prepare the way for the LORD. Look, God the LORD will come with strength, and his arm is ruling for him. Look, his reward is with him. The result of his work is in front of him. Like a shepherd he will care for his flock. With his arm he will gather the lambs. He will lift them up on his lap. (*Isaiah 40:3,10-11*)
- P: As the fourth candle is lit, rejoice, because we have a faithful and loving God. Rejoice, because he has sent his Son just as he has promised. Rejoice, because through his gracious and almighty power, we can be faithful and ever prepared to meet our coming Savior.

Prepare my heart, Lord Jesus; turn not from me aside, And help me to receive you this blessed Adventide. From stall and manger low come now to dwell within me; I'll sing your praises gladly and forth your glory show.

Prayer of the Day

P: O gracious and faithful God, we know you keep your word, especially your promise to send a Savior. In Jesus, we see the fulfillment of countless promises. In Jesus, we see your faithful compassion in rescuing us from sin and punishment. In Jesus, we have the encouragement and strength to be faithful in every situation. Keep us in your undeserved love. Strengthen us in every time of weakness and temptation. Fill us with your Holy Spirit to keep us faithful until we see our Savior and are welcomed into your heavenly kingdom. There we will praise you throughout endless ages as our true, faithful, and compassionate God—Father, Son, and Spirit.

Old Testament

2 Samuel 7:8-16

⁸You are also to say the following to my servant David. This is what the LORD of Armies says. I took you from the pasture, from following sheep, to be ruler over my people, over Israel. ⁹I have been with you wherever you went. I have cut off all your enemies from before you. I will make your reputation great, like that of the great ones on the earth. ¹⁰I will set up a place for my

people Israel, and I will plant them there. They will dwell there, and they will not be disturbed again. Violent men will not afflict them again as they did at the beginning ¹¹ and ever since the day I appointed judges over my people Israel. I will give you rest from all your enemies.

The LORD also declares to you that the LORD himself will make a house for you. ¹²When your days are complete and you rest with your fathers, I will raise up after you your seed, who will come from your own body. ²⁶In the sixth month, the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee named Nazareth, ²⁷to a virgin pledged in marriage to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women."

²⁹But she was greatly troubled by the statement and was wondering what kind of greeting this could be. ³⁰The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, because you have found favor with God. ³¹Listen, you will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to name him Jesus. ³²He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Confession of Faith

(We join in the words of the Nicene Creed)

C: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father;

P: Lift up your hearts.






P: Let us give thanks to the Lord, our God.

The Words of Institution

Then he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying: "Drink from it, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me."
