Confession of Sins

P: St. Paul writes: “But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son to be born of a woman, so that he would be born under law, in order to redeem those under law.” As sinners we are under the condemnation of God's just and holy Law. We have rebelled against his will. We have rejected his Word. We have resisted his loving leadership. In humility, we must pray:



C: Lord, have mer — cy.

P: When we examine ourselves we find nothing in us but sin and death. Our best works are nothing more than filthy rags, completely unworthy of any merit before God. We also know there is no escape from the eternal consequences of our sinful rebellion. Because of our unworthiness, we must plead:



C: Christ, have mer — cy.

P: O Almighty and most merciful Father, we must confess that we are completely corrupted by sin. We see disobedience in our thoughts, in our words, and in our every action. We must also confess, we deserve nothing from you except your just judgment. But we come trusting in the compassion and merits of our Savior and Substitute, Jesus Christ:



C: Lord, have mer — cy.

The Absolution

P: Because of the perfect obedience and boundless compassion of Jesus, our new-born Savior, we can be confident God has heard and answered our cry for mercy. He has forgiven our sins and declared us free from guilt and punishment. Truly, God is good to all who call on him and look to his Son through faith. Thankful for this great out-pouring of undeserved love, we join in praising God with our voices, and serving him with our lives.

Luke 1:46-55
