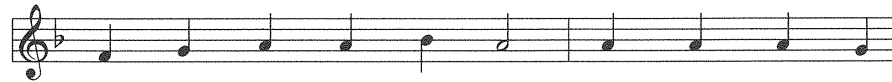

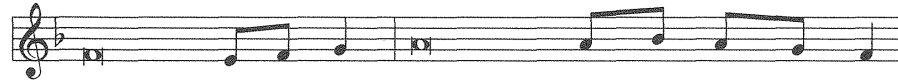
God's Forgiveness Proclaimed

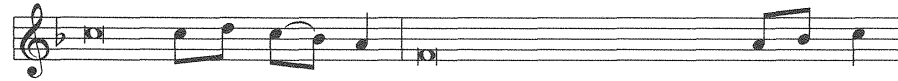

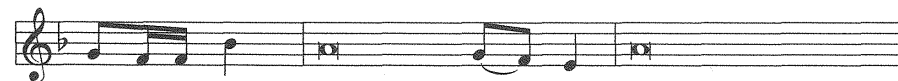

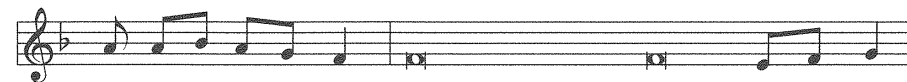
