


Gathering Rite on Holy Baptism

- P In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C Amen.

Please stand.



- P I tell you the truth, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless he is born of water and the Spirit.
- C Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit.
- P Surely we were sinful at birth, sinful from the time our mothers conceived us.
- C But we were washed, we were sancified, we were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.



P As baptized children of God, we confess our sins.

C Holy and merciful Father, I confess that I am by nature sinful and that I have disobeyed you in my thoughts, words and actions. I have done what is evil and failed to do what is good. For this, I deserve your punishment both now and in eternity. But I am truly sorry for my sins, and trusting in my Savior Jesus Christ, I pray: Lord, have mercy on me, a sinner.



P Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless.

Therefore, as a called servant of Christ and by his authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus told us, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these." By the power of God's Word, this gracious water of life washes away sins, delivers from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe.

Receive the sign of the cross on the head and heart + to mark you as a redeemed child of Christ.


Jocelyn Julia Bernerius, I baptize you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.


They will dwell securely, for at that time he will be great to the ends of the earth.

Second Lesson - Hebrews 10:4-10

We could not possibly raise ourselves up to God. So, the Son of God obeyed the law for us and by his sacrifice has made us holy. Christ has lifted up the lowly.

⁴The fact is that the blood of bulls and goats cannot take away sins.

⁵Therefore when he entered the world, Christ said: Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but you prepared a body for me. ⁶You were not pleased with burnt offerings and sin offerings.

⁷Then I said, "Here I am. I have come to do your will, God. In the scroll of the book it is written about me." ⁸First he said: Sacrifices and offerings that were offered according to the law, both burnt offerings and sin offerings, you did not desire, and you were not pleased with them.

⁹Then he said: Here I am. I have come to do your will. He does away with the first in order to establish the second.


¹⁰By this will, we have been sanctified once and for all, through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ.

Gospel - Luke 1:39-55

In Spirit-wrought humility, Mary knew she needed a Savior. God lifts her up, making her the mother of that Savior.

³⁹In those days Mary got up and hurried to the hill country, to a town of Judah. ⁴⁰She entered the home of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹Just as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. ⁴²She called out with a loud voice and said, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! ⁴³But why am I so favored that the mother of my Lord should come to me? ⁴⁴In fact, just now, as soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy! ⁴⁵Blessed is she who believed, because the promises spoken to her from the Lord will be fulfilled!"

⁴⁶Then Mary said,

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, ⁴⁷and my spirit has rejoiced in God my Savior, ⁴⁸because he has looked with favor on the humble state of his servant.

Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed, ⁴⁹because the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.

⁵⁰His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. ⁵¹He has shown strength with his arm. He has scattered those who were proud in the thoughts of their hearts. ⁵²He has brought down rulers from their thrones. He has lifted up the lowly.

⁵³He has filled the hungry with good things, but the rich he has sent away empty. ⁵⁴He has come to the aid of his servant Israel, remembering his mercy, ⁵⁵as he spoke to our fathers, to Abraham and his offspring forever.


P Praise to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In love he has blessed us with every spiritual blessing.

Words of Institution



O Christ, Lamb of God - Agnus Dei



Distribution


